Legion Court seniors forced to deal with broken elevator

"We are checking with Otis Elevator for an update on the status of the manufacturing of the new elevator shaft for the Legion Court Apartments. They will hopefully have something for us tomorrow morning (October 10), which will include, again I hope, an installation date, and we will communicate what we find out from them to our tenants," the e-mail from Walisser explains. "Unfortunately, we are at the mercy of the manufacturer of the new elevator shaft and the elevator company who will be installing it. I am sure they are doing everything they can to expedite the repairs as they are keenly aware that this is a seniors (sic) apartment."

Susan Miller, a former Grimshaw resident, learned of the elevator outage when she was in Town visiting friends living at Legion

"I do come back to this

community to keep in touch and I like to go visit my seniors and it's convenient for me because two or three of them live in the Legion Court," she said. "I was absolutely appalled that one of my senior lady friends has been stuck on her floor for two and a half months."

Miller said she was beyond upset seeing residents in circumstances.

"It's disheartening, it's smacks of utmost disrespect to these women who are the core of our history, of our community," she said. "They pay a huge percentage of their income to stay there, that's their home.'

Residents who are mobile enough living on the second floor of the twostory building aren't as severely affected, however, those who are not mobile enough to take the stairs on their own are bound to their floor.


Residents of the building say they're becoming impatient with continued delays, which are forcing senior residents to continue having to carry groceries up stairs.

"It's very difficult going upstairs carrying groceries and things," said another resident that asked not to be named.

"Some people have bad backs and another person has a puffer and when he gets [to the top] he's out of breath," another resident

One resident fairly unaffected by the elevator situation said they're tired of seeing neighbours suffer.

"It's not that bad [for me]. I say people here are pretty good, I have groceries brought to me so I don't have to worry about the stairs," the resident said. "It's others who I worry about. They just come up to the end of the stairs and they're just beat."
